

A crown jewel of Lower Merion's local industries, The Autocar Company moved from Pittsburgh to Lancaster Avenue in Ardmore in 1900. It was founded by three brothers named Clarke: Louis, John and James. For more than 50 years it employed as many a thousand men and women a day to make cars and trucks until 1911, after which date they made only trucks until it was bought by White Motors and moved to Exton, PA in 1954.
