Celebrating Archives Month

October is American Archives Month, an initiative spearheaded by the Society of American Archivists. The month serves as an annual opportunity to raise public awareness about the crucial role archivists and archives play in preserving history and making information accessible to the public -- a key focus for us here at the Society!

Under the guidance of Administrative Coordinator Paige Bartello, our dedicated intern Xandra O'Neill is processing over 100 years of records from the Woman's Club of Bala Cynwyd. Earlier this year, the Society



was awarded a Historical and Archival Records Care Grant from the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission to process this collection. Along the way, Xandra is bringing to light hidden history in these archives, leveraging expertise from her Masters in Library and Information Science from Pennsylvania Western University. Cynwyd Heritage Trail signage: the results are in!

In 2009, Lower Merion Township received a grant to highlight the Cynwyd

Heritage Trail's rich railroad and industrial history. Working with the Lower Merion Historical Society, the Township created and installed 17 interpretive panels in 2013. View the Cynwyd Trail Interpretive Signage Map & Content



The Friends of the Cynwyd Heritage Trail is looking to refresh this

signage and we partnered with them to survey users of the trail. Some key findings are that a significant majority of respondents find the signs informative and interesting - but they want more! In particular, respondents are interested in new content featuring photos and maps from different time periods; Indigenous history and early land use; and general history of Bala Cynwyd and Lower Merion.

As progress continues with the extension of the trail from the Cynwyd Station to City Avenue along the existing rail line, we look forward to exploring ways to share more about the rich history of our community.


Tuesday, October 28 | 6:30PM - 8 PM

Historical Society Rewind

Those of you who follow our <u>Facebook page</u> may have noticed some amazing stories recently shared, researched and written by our Board member <u>Jamie Singer</u>. Below we feature one of her back-to-school spotlights:

We take a look at a unique Lower Merion elementary school that was designed by an architect chosen specifically because he had never designed a school! It's Penn Valley Elementary.

In post-war 1949, folks were looking for innovation. This school became a project that was embraced by the community. Even today, Penn Valley still boasts its unusual original features, despite renovations in recent years.

Notable are the unique brightly colored stained glass panels in the lobby and nursery-rhyme characters in glazed tiles on the exterior walls.
